# Years of Plenty/Years of Want: Giving at PRBC

In Genesis 41, Pharaoh had two dreams. One featured seven attractive and plump cows and seven ugly and thin cows. The thin and ugly cows ate the plump cows. The other dream had seven plump and good ears of grain and seven thin and blighted ears of grain. Again, in this dream the less desirable ears swallowed up the plump ones.

When Pharaoh called Joseph forward to interpret his dreams, Joseph told Pharaoh that the dreams were one in the same. The seven good cows and seven good ears represented seven years of great plenty in Egypt. Conversely, the seven thin cows and seven blighted ears represented seven years of want that would follow the years of plenty. Joseph's recommendation based on the coming 14 years was to store up and save well during the seven years of plenty so that Egypt would not perish during the seven years of want.

Park River Bible Camp has had its own share of years of plenty and years of want. Currently, it could be said that PRBC is experiencing a a season of want. Fortunately, the Board of Directors has been judicious in its use of funds given to PRBC by its wonderful base of donors and came into this season of want with a healthy savings account. Unfortunately, that which was stored during the previous season of plenty is running out.

This ministry thrives on the support of donors. Your donations allow us to not only pay the bills; they also allow us to keep costs low for those who attend camp. A typical weeklong summer camp costs a family about \$225 to send a child to PRBC. However, their registration fee only covers 40%-45% of the actual cost to run camp and a number of families struggle to even pay that.

Would you help this ministry continue to grow its program, maintain its facility, and proclaim the Gospel to hundreds of people of all ages each year?
