Claimed!

I don't know what most siblings are like, but I assume at least some are similar to mine, because my older sister had to get her material somewhere. Now, before I say anything else, I need to clarify something: while growing up, I was twice as mean to her as she was to me, so I deserved every word she ever said. Now, I'm not adopted, but I remember her trying to insult me by saying, "You're adopted." I couldn't quite comprehend why I should find that insulting, but I figured she intended to make me feel like the weird one in the family. So being the witty young boy I was, I replied, "That's why I'm normal and all the rest of you are weird."

I hope my family forgives me for this. And my sister is a very kind woman; we have a wonderful relationship.

Of all the insults we swapped, I remember that one well, not because it hurt, but because it was such a peculiar thing to use as an insult. What would be so bad about being adopted? Do you know what being adopted means? It means your parent(s) really, really wanted you, made a choice to claim you, and chose to

love you unconditionally. Adoption is an incredible act of love, and a great illustration of God's love.

At camp this summer, one of our memory verses was Ephesians 1:5. It says, "[God] predestined us for adoption through Jesus Christ, according to the purpose of his will." Do you realize what this means for you? It means God really, really wanted *you*, made a choice to claim *you*, and chose to love *you* unconditionally.

God knew exactly what He was doing when He decided this. He knew who you would be and all the things you would do. Be honest with yourself; the picture God saw of you was not a pretty one. God adopts us, not because we deserve it, but because we need it. He also knew what His plan to adopt us would entail, and the picture of His Son on the cross is not a pretty one either. But this is how God resolved to deal with our sin. He placed it on Jesus Christ so that He might carry it with Him into death, and leave it there when He rose to perfect life. Jesus was obedient to His Father in this so that we too might be sons and daughters.
