Chapel Update

Praise the Lord! Dedicated followers of Jesus Christ with a passion for reaching the lost and encouraging

faith relationships with Jesus Christ banded together to form Park River Bible Camp in 1936. Soon afterward they began work on the Chapel, which was completed in 1947. Sixty-two years later we are still being blessed by the work God did through these men and women. It is our belief that God still has much work to do in the lives of people today. So moving forward in faith, we are taking steps to prepare a place for people to meet God for another 60+ years or until the Lord returns bodily.

The progress on the Chapel is going well. Here is a list of what has been done recently: The seamless steel siding is now on and seamless gutters have been attached. The stonework on the exterior of the fireplace is complete. And foam insulation has been blown into the upper part of the chapel.

Shortly, a new cross-shaped window will be installed on the front.

We are looking forward to the chapel portion being completed this winter, and the new bathrooms, Lord willing, should also be completed before spring with a tile floor and the rest of the fixtures and partitions installed.

The Chapel was originally constructed with the help of many volunteers. We praise God today
