Chapel Completed

the first session

at Park River Bible Camp was held. In those early days there were no buildings, just tents, people, and the presence of Christ.

Nine years later a unanimous decision from the Board of Directors put into motion the building of a Chapel. In 1946 the floor and foundation were laid, but due to wartime shortages of materials, construction was soon halted. However. in 1947, building material was secured and construction was resumed. The plan ing it on a new foundation with geotherwas to build a 60' x 100' building with room for 1100 people along with a side addition 34' x 40' to be used for classroom space: this would later be known as the Fireside Room.

On July 27, 1947, the cornerstone of the chapel was set in place and most of

In June of 1936, the building was completed to the glory of Christ the Chief Cornerstone. Exactly one year later, the Chapel was dedicated and the possibilities of ministry at PRBC were greatly expanded.

> About 60 years later, through an amazing estate gift from John Paulson, Park River Bible Camp saw the potential for even more ministry possibilities to be done in the name of Christ. Mr. Paulson's gift, paired with more than 2,000 hours of volunteer labor, enabled the camp to fully winterize the Chapel, placmal heating; build a larger Fireside Room; add much-needed bathrooms; and provide an updated and more centralized office space, kitchenette, and conference room.

From the Director's Desk

May 13th marks an important day in the church calendar, the Ascension of Our Lord. Because it lands on a Thursday and takes place forty days after the Resurrection and ten days before Pentecost, the Ascension of Our Lord is often forgotten and neglected. However, the theology inherent in the Ascension brings a great

word of hope to fallen humanity.

The Ascension (see Luke 24:50-53 or Acts 1:6-11) is what we call the event in which Jesus leaves the world and his disciples in order to send the Holy Spirit (John 16). However, many people think of Jesus' ascension as though it were some kind of escape from his real and fleshly humanity. Some think of Jesus' ascension into heaven as the same kind of process a two-stage rocket might go through, as if once Jesus

was far enough away from earth he could jettison his human body in order to allow his soul to enter heaven's courts unhindered.

However, the message of Scripture is that in the Ascension, Christ takes the broken, ugly, marred, and frail humanity into which he was born and baptized and brings it into the heavenly court of God and presents it to the Father, redeemed, beautiful and restored.

The entirety of Christ's bodily resurrected Tammy Olson self now sits at the right hand of God the Father, representing our still frail human selves before God. For, just as Christ was baptized into our decaying mortality, we are baptized into his glorious immortality and into the promise of new life. Thanks be to God for the crucified, resurrected, and ascended Lord Jesus Christ, Amen.
