The farmer, who wishes to remain anonymous, said it is important to have Park River Bible Camp's name on the grain ticket should one choose to designate a portion of one's crop to the camp.

From the Director's Desk

I've been reading a lot on justification by faith alone lately and recently I heard a sermon that very much dealt with the subject head on.

The pastor said that many Christians today, if asked, could give you the basics of the faith; that we are saved through Christ's death and resurrection. However, the pastor believes many Christians don't actually hold that conviction too deeply. He feels that many Christians don't actually believe what they confess, but instead believe that their salvation is somehow dependant on what they do. They wonder whether or not they are good enough.

Because of my experience with young people, I sadly have to agree with him. In our interviews and discussions with potential camp counselors and in conversations with many of the youth that attend camp, it is painfully obvious that many of them (and

New Adventures at Park River Bible Camp!

This summer we are offering a number of new programs here at Park River Bible Camp! These include an expanded "counselor in training" program, a family fun day, an extra campout for senior high students, and a sports camp. While these programs vary in nature from each other, each one is being implemented to further carry out the mission of Park River Bible Camp – to encourage faith relationships with Jesus Christ.

The first of these new programs is a "family fun day" for families with young children. The day will include a worship service geared for young children and a variety of "go at your own pace" activities for families to do together throughout the day. It will provide a wonderful day for parents, grandparents, and children to grow in faith and have a great time together.

The second of these new programs is a sports camp for young people who will finish sixth, seventh, or eighth grade this spring. In addition to Bible studies, worship, campfires, and all camp games, we will be offering training and instruction in basketball and volleyball. As campers grow in their athletic skills they will also grow in their awareness of their need for the grace of God given to us through His Son Jesus Christ.

us) still don't get it. So many of us simply cannot believe Paul when he tells us that "one is justified by faith apart from works of the law." Romans 3:28.

Our old selves are constantly vying for control over our salvation. We want something to do and we desire to have a role in God's saving work. We simply refuse to let go of a control we don't really have anyway. For the Christian this can only cause despair and uncertainty as we are forced to ask, "Have I done enough?"

Our other two new programs are for senior high

youth. The first of these is more accurately an expansion and remodeling of our existing counselor in training program. To interested students having completed 10-12 grades, we are offering a "counselor in training" training week in which they will experience many of the elements of our senior high camp but also receive theological and ministry training. Students having successfully completed this training week will be eligible to serve as "counselors in training" during any of our following 2012 summer sessions with the exception of senior high week. We believe this expansion will provide senior high students with a wonderful opportunity to grow in their knowledge of the Christian faith, observe our staff teach children, and get some practice teaching under the direction of our staff.

Finally, we are offering a one-night campout a few weeks after senior high camp for our senior high youth. This will give our senior high campers another opportunity to come together, hear the Gospel, and have a great time together.
